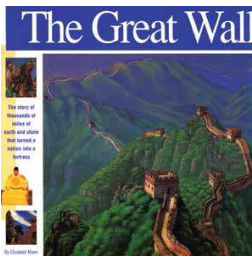

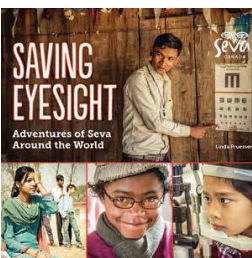

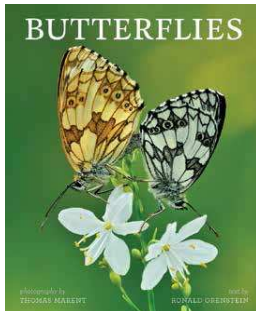
ALICE IN WONDERLAND

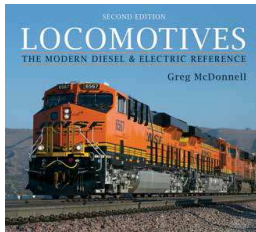

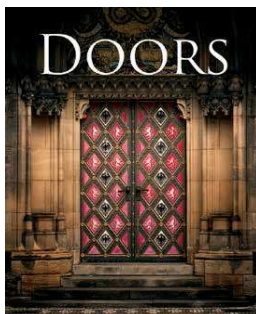

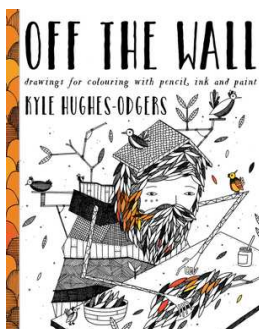


Purple Prose
